


All About Foxes



Foxes are smart and tricky animals that usually hunt and live alone. They eat a variety of foods, including small animals, birds, insects, fruits, and vegetables. They have a special way of catching mice by jumping high into the air and landing on them.

One amazing thing about foxes is how they can live near people. In cities, they often look for food in trash cans and gardens. Even though they are wild animals, they have learned to live around humans and can often be seen in neighborhoods.

A fox's life starts in the spring when a mother fox, called a vixen, has baby foxes, known as pups. She usually has four to six pups. The pups are born blind and need their mother to take care of them. The vixen stays in the den with the pups while the father fox brings food. As the pups grow, they learn how to hunt and survive.


